How to Open the Files

- PNG files — open with any image viewer or web browser
- SVG files — open on a COMPUTER: drag and drop into Chrome, Firefox, or Edge (or use Inkscape)
- PDF files — open with Adobe Reader, Preview, or any PDF viewer (works on phones too)
- TXT files — open with any text editor or Notepad

Tip: SVG files will NOT preview in a phone's photo/gallery app — it shows a broken-image icon, but the file is fine. Open SVGs in a web browser on a computer. If you just want to start stitching, use the printable PDF charts — they open on any device.

Materials You'll Need

- 1 Aida Fabric (14 count)**
The most common fabric for cross-stitch. Size info is in the DMC Thread List.
- 2 DMC Embroidery Floss**
Colors and quantities are listed in the DMC Thread List. Buy at any craft store.
- 3 Tapestry Needle (Size 24 or 26)**
Blunt tip needle designed for cross-stitch. Won't split the fabric threads.
- 4 Embroidery Hoop or Frame**
Keeps your fabric taut while stitching. Any size that fits your work area.
- 5 Small Scissors**
For cutting thread. Embroidery scissors work best.

How to Start Stitching

1 Open the DMC Thread List

Check which DMC colors you need and how many skeins of each.

2 Buy your supplies

Get the Aida fabric, DMC floss, needle, and hoop from a craft store.

3 Cut your fabric

Leave 3-4 inches of extra fabric on each side of the pattern area.

4 Find the center

Fold the fabric in half both ways to find the center. Mark it lightly.

5 Match the center of your chart

Start stitching from the center of the pattern outward.

6 Read the chart

Each square = one cross-stitch. Match the symbol to the DMC color in the legend.

7 Stitch one color at a time

This keeps the back neat and makes it easier to count.

8 Use 2 strands of floss

Separate 2 strands from the 6-strand DMC floss for cross-stitches.

How to Use the Backstitch Version

Backstitch adds outlines that make the design look sharper and more defined.

- Open the backstitch version of the chart (files ending with '_Backstitch')
- The red lines on the chart show where to add back stitches
- Use 1 strand of DMC 310 (Black) for all back stitches
- Stitch the back stitches LAST, after all cross-stitches are done
- If you prefer a softer look, you can skip the backstitch entirely

Two versions are included so you can choose what you like best!

Using Pattern Keeper App

Pattern Keeper is a popular app (Android) that makes stitching easier:

- Download Pattern Keeper from Google Play Store (\$9 one-time)
- Load the Symbol_Pattern.pdf into the app
- The app lets you zoom, mark completed stitches, and track your progress
- Our PDF uses vector text so Pattern Keeper can read the symbols correctly
